#### **Humber Estuary: Changing Views**

#### Saturday 16 December 2017 to Saturday 17 February 2018 Beverley Art Gallery | FREE

The Humber Estuary, along with its canals and tributaries, has inspired artists for centuries. Painted landscapes, riverscapes and industrial views are shown alongside specially commissioned film footage from the Yorkshire Film Archive. Oral history recordings tell stories of life on the Humber. The exhibition features hands-on activities for children.

Humber Estuary: Changing Views is a Humber Museum Partnership (HMP) project and is funded by Arts Council England. It features historic paintings and social history items on loan from HMP partners and a range of public museums and private collectors. It also includes contemporary works: two specially commissioned pieces by Ian Mitchell, and a body of work by Stephen Todd.

#### Rhythms in Sculpture by David Sprakes

David Sprakes's sculptures are based on the natural world and the landscape of the Peak District and the North East coast. Inspired by weathered, eroded objects observed and collected in the landscape, the artist translates these into abstract sculptures where textured and patinated surfaces are balanced against polished areas.

Drawing, clay modelling, mould-making, casting, construction and carving illustrates the breadth of techniques in David's work. The exhibition introduces various materials, each suited to demonstrate the artist's sensitivity to form and texture and their change with the passing of time.


#### Saturday 5 May to Saturday 30 June Treasure House | FREE

Our Histories Revealed: African Stories in Hull and East Yorkshire is a Heritage Lottery funded community project. Its aim is to explore the stories of local people of African descent from 1750 to 2007.

Over the last two years, stories, images and oral histories cataloguing peoples' experiences have been collected. Now highlights of this work are brought together in our revealing exhibition at the Treasure House. Earliest stories include visits to the area by Shakespearean actor Ira Aldridge and America's Fisk Jubilee Singers. Learn about the contributions made by servicemen and women in WWII such as Wylie Young, stationed at Cottingham and Hull's Lilian Bader who served with the WAAF

We also uncover local family histories such as the Weeks and Ema families and highlight the great sportsmen Clive Sullivan and Roy Francis. Challenging subjects are also explored, including the death of Christopher Alder in 1998.



#### Snakes... a Slither into a Secretive Life

## Saturday 14 July to Saturday 8 September Beverley Art Gallery and Treasure House | FREE

This exciting natural history exhibition delves into the fascinating life of snakes from around the world. Within the exhibition are real snake specimens which can be seen as displays of taxidermy or skeletons.

Get up close to these mysterious creatures and see their behaviour and anatomy. This family friendly exhibition asks questions such as "How do snakes feed?", "Why do some snakes have venom?" and "Why are they patterned?".

Investigate the weight of snakes, the length that some large snake species can actually grow to and how snake camouflage works. The exhibition includes an 13ft Burmese python skeleton, a King cobra, and a Rhinoceros viper as well as an array of other species. Snakes is a creation of Blue Tokay — a touring exhibition company specialising in natural history.



#### Birds, Blooms and Butterflies: Elizabeth Lambert's Art

#### **EXHIBITION**

The early part of the nineteenth century saw a rise in the popularity of botanical and natural history drawing, attributed in part to a growing interest in all things to do with the natural world.

In Beverley, a young woman named Elizabeth Lambert (1791 – 1830) was captivated by this popular hobby. Over her relatively short lifetime, Elizabeth produced hundreds of finely detailed drawings and watercolours.

As well as being a talented artist, Elizabeth was also musical and played the organ at St Mary's Church. For many years, Elizabeth's portfolio of surviving artworks was stored away in California, in the care of a descendent Nicholas McGegan, who has spent his working life as an international conductor of classical music.

Birds, Blooms and Butterflies displays for the first time these beautiful artworks and explores Elizabeth's life, touching on the middle class society in which she lived.

#### Peripheral Vision: Straw People by Julian Swift

#### **EXHIBITION**

#### Saturday 15 September to Saturday 3 November Beverley Art Gallery | FREE

Julian's straw-people fantasy came to life in the 1990s when he witnessed two boiler suited straw scarecrows appearing to conduct a conversation in a cabbage field in Norfolk, courtesy of the breeze catching their arms.

Subsequently, the artist created a whole substrata of straw society invisible to humans, utilising things which affluent society throws away.

There is indeed a great sense of pathos and humour in seeing these imaginary folk strive, largely unsuccessfully, to fit in with human society and customs, secretly adopting behaviours they have only ever witnessed from the field.

The exhibition features mainly oil crayon drawings on gouache, linked to Julian's literary exploitation of the subject.

Join Dr Robb Robinson and Dr Alex Ombler as they take you on a voyage through this fascinating aspect of our local maritime history.



Found images are recycled using painting, printmaking and collage, reflecting colonial divisions of the Middle East that have consequences reverberating to the present day.

Learn how to create your own digital reconstructions of Hull and East Riding maritime heritage directly from plans, illustrations and other documents held in the Archives.


